The Shakhsiyah Model

7 PRINCIPLES

The seven Principles of Shakhsiyah Education are derived from the understanding of the *dīn* as *Imān*, *Islam* and *Iḥsān*. We connect these concepts to traditional Islamic educational concepts, *tarbiyah*, *ta'līm* and *ta'dib*. The following principles shape every aspect of our work in our schools and educational projects. They bind us together as a community of learning.

THEMATIC CURRICULUM

Our approach to learning is interdisciplinary. Our schemes of work consist of six-week long 'themes' that guide subject-specific explorations of the world around us. For example, in Year 4, learners would explore the water cycle in Science, and cyclical theories of the rise and fall of civilisations in History. This gives learners a holistic, connected, comprehensive worldview.

HALAQAH

Halaqah is the heart of our curriculum, in which learners and the educator sit in a circle and learn from each other through dialogue, following the sunnah of the Prophet Muhammad (saw). Halaqah acts as a starting point for all thematic learning and facilitates learners to connect their Islamic worldview with their subject areas. Halaqah thus draws together all the different subject-specific learning within a 'theme'.
